Examples of "WHAT COUNTS" towards the Presidential Service Award

COUNTS	DOES NOT COUNT
Volunteering to play an instrument/sing at nursing home. Time spent at nursing home with residents performing, and visiting – counts.	Practice time to prepare to volunteer and perform at the nursing home does NOT COUNT towards PVSA hours.
Volunteering as a peer mentor or as supervised or directed by teacher at Evergreen*. There can be NO incentive provided monetarily or with grades/ extra credit as this is considered "payment." *May NOT be performed during a student's class time (PE, math, etc.).	Helping a friend or classmate with homework or to study for a test.
Participating in 5K as long as it is for event either as a runner/walker OR as a help out at the event. ***Please use integrity when reporting time participating as a runner/walker in a 5K.***	Participating in a 5K that is not a fundraiser (for example "The Color Run").
Time spent raising money for a cause (lemonade stand, etc.) may count towards volunteer hours accrued.	Donating money to a cause.
Volunteering with youth groups for community projects (Habitat for Humanity, Operation Sandwich, Room in the Inn, etc.) or participating in service activities through a school club.	Being part of a leadership club, student council at school or as a member of youth group/religious school. Meetings do not count.

Volunteer work with church, temple, synagogue Volunteering with children in Vacation Bible School or tutoring children in Hebrew may count as volunteer work. Volunteering to drive a person coming to your church, temple, synagogue to do charity work counts.	Volunteer work with a religious organization may count so long as students do not proselytize (to try to persuade people to join a religion, cause, or group). Participation in religious rituals does NOT count (for example: serving as an altar server, preparing or giving sermons, assisting clergy with religious rituals or services, lighting candles in synagogue, singing/dancing/performing during a religious service, etc. does not count) Giving up your room/bed to host a missionary or other public sector worker does not count.
Babysitting in a faith-based nursery, daycare, women or men's shelter, or community center without any type of compensation (pay), counts.	Babysitting for friends or family, or for any compensation.
Volunteering with language club, or other school sponsored clubs - in the community - may count towards the PVSA.	Hosting a foreign exchange student is a wonderful thing to do, but does not count as volunteer work.
Preparing and delivering food or other necessities to others in need as part of a volunteer position with a community based organization counts.	Helping a friend, neighbor or family member in crisis is a wonderful thing to do, and often the right thing to do; however, this help does not qualify as "volunteer work" in the community.
